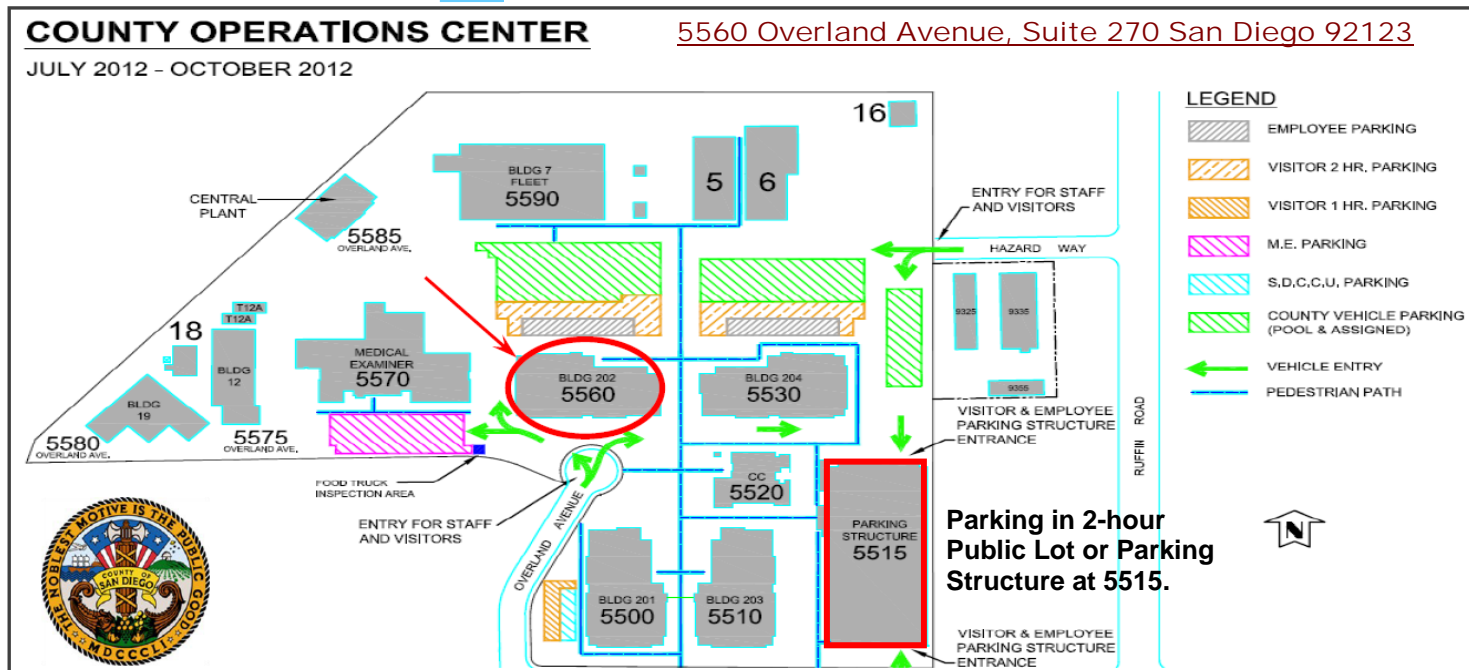

Behind the Scenes—Records Management on the U. S. S. Midway

Please joins us as David Hanson gives us a behind the scenes view of the types of items that his department deals with, and how they track them. Logging everything from a small set of pilot’s wings to a 40,000 pound aircraft, his team uses dedicated museum software to catalog all of the loaned and donated items. New items are acquired constantly, and the collection has really grown in the last eight years. His department uses their collections to provide objects and information to a variety of other departments onboard, supporting the missions of the museum. His department is usually not seen by the one million annual visitors to the ship, so this is a rare opportunity for the public to get a look “behind the scenes” at the USS Midway.



David has been with the Midway since 1998, working as a volunteer to prepare for the opening of the museum in the six years before the ship opened to the public in 2004. Since that time he has been the Collections Manager for the USS Midway and fills the role of curator for the museum. As the head of their Curatorial Department he oversees all of the artifacts that are donated or loaned to the museum. His department also encompasses the museum’s research library, which he says is the “best naval aviation library in the West”.



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
